Course Description

This is a survey of the methods of Bible study. Included as a part of this study are the synthetic, inductive, biographical, historical, theological, and devotional methods. For this course, the inductive study method will be emphasized and includes the steps of observation, interpretation, application, and correlation. Principles in these steps are applied to biblical passages and books.

Course Objectives

At the conclusion of this course the student should be able to:

- 1. Develop an appreciation for God's Holy Word.
- 2. Develop an appetite for personal Bible study.
- 3. Utilize the inductive method of Bible study.
- 4. Recognize the author's style of writing in any biblical passage.
- 5. Learn to ask the most fruitful questions to discover the meaning of any passage.
- 6. Value what it means to follow God's Word using the heart, mind, imagination, and emotions.
- 7. Discover the author's audience and purpose in a passage of Scripture, and make careful use of this information in interpretation and application.
- 8. Correlate the results of Bible Study into philosophy of life and worldview.
- 9. Explain the purposes of various basic Bible study tools, and gain skill in using them to study and interpret Scripture.
- 10. Outline a chapter and a book of the Bible.

Course Requirements

- 1. Students are expected to bring a Bible to class every day and a notebook to take personal notes.
- 2. Students will have various assignments to complete during the classroom time based on the instructor's direction.
- 3. Chapter Summary Analysis. Following the instructions for *Chapter Summary Analysis* to be handed out in class, analyze the OT book of Jonah. After prayer, (1) read it 4 or 5 times through to get the sense of it; (2) divide each chapter into paragraphs; (3) reduce each paragraph to a 35 word summary or less; (4) label each paragraph with a title; (5) summarize each chapter in 35 words or less; (6) give each chapter a title; and (7) Pick out the key verse for each chapter.

Course Procedures

The primary classroom method will be a combination of lecture and discussion. We should be able to learn from one another as long as the Bible is our authority and we are developing the skill of inductive Bible study.
