### **Course Description**

The systematic study of the biblical doctrines of inspiration, God, trinity, and angels with appreciation of the history and development of Christian theology. Teaching on Scripture develops the case for its inspiration, authority, and infallibility as written revelation of God. Included are instructions on God's attributes and angels as created spirit beings.

# **Course Objectives**

Upon successful completion of this course you should be able to:

- 1. Explain the nature of God's revelation and what makes special revelation more complete than general revelation.
- 2. Identify four theories of biblical inspiration and point out the weaknesses of those that differ from plenary inspiration.
- 3. Define the terms revelation, inspiration, and illumination.
- 4. Describe the genuineness of the Bible and explain why we can rely on it for guidance in faith and practice.
- 5. Discuss the formation of the Old and New Testament canon.
- 6. Identify ways of confirming God's existence and point out the results of believing that God exists.
- 7. Present a biblical description of God's nature and qualities.
- 8. Explain how specific relationships and qualities of God are indicated by biblical names of God.
- 9. Explain how biblical names and activities of God support the doctrine of the Trinity.
- 10. Identify and give the significance of the works of God.
- 11. Summarize biblical teaching concerning the origin and existence of angels.
- 12. Explain how some angels rebelled against God and lost their original position, even though all angels were created good and holy.
- 13. Describe the nature, position, and activity of angels.
- 14. Enjoy a closer relationship to God as you apply your increased knowledge of Him and His economy to your daily life.
