Course Description

The systematic study of the biblical doctrines of sin, salvation, and the nature and work of Christ. The course also includes a biblical study of divine healing.

Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course you should be able to:

1. Summarize biblical teaching concerning the origin and nature of man.

2. Explain and refute non-biblical views concerning the nature and origin of man.

3. State basic principles of the biblical doctrine of sin.

4. Discuss and refute non-biblical theories concerning sin.

5. Answer common questions on such subjects as the relationship of sin and demonic activities, the unpardonable sin, and degrees of sin.

6. Appreciate the practical implications of the doctrine that man was created in God's image.

7. Describe the destinies of restored man and rebellious man.

8. Show the roles of God and mankind in salvation.

9. Define the biblical and theological terms relating to the doctrines of salvation,

including justification and sanctification and understand that precise defining of terms is a necessary background for intelligently proclaiming the truths of salvation.

10.Understand how divine healing relates to salvation.

11. Contrast the method of salvation presented in the Bible with any nonbiblical approach.

12. Commit your mind and life fully to the way of salvation that God has provided.

13. Appreciate more deeply the love, grace, and wisdom of God in the saving of mankind.

14. Be more sensitive to the need of mankind everywhere to know Jesus Christ as Savior.

15. Give yourself more fully to prayer that God may use you to bring others to Christ.

16. Preach or teach these doctrines to strengthen the faith of Christians.

17. Evaluate present and past doctrines pertaining to Christ and refute those that are not scriptural.

18. Identify some of the leading authors and scholars who have contributed to the field of Christology.

19. Relate Christology with other great doctrines of the Bible, including the doctrine of salvation and the doctrine of the Trinity.

20. Recognize and use in your teaching or preaching numerous direct references to the person and work of Jesus Christ to be found in the Old Testament historical record.

21. Evaluate and organize the facts concerning Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection and consider how they relate to God's overall plan.

22. Teach the biblical truth of the true deity and true humanity of Christ in the incarnation.

23. Understand better and appreciate more deeply Christ's incarnation and earthly ministry, the provisions made for you through His death, and what His resurrection can mean in your personal life.

24. Preach or teach on the meaning of Christ's second coming and His future heavenly ministry.
